

The Table, A Place of Revolution

Dear Siblings in Christ,

Have you ever noticed that Jesus' ministry oscillates around tables? If you pay attention to the Holy Week events, Jesus goes from the table on Maundy Thursday to the table where the disciples were gathered after the resurrection. John writes: "When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." (John 20:19)

The house where the disciples were was most probably the place where they had had the Passover meal a few days before, the house where Jesus had washed their feet and called them his friends and shared bread and wine.

The events go from table, to tomb, and back to the table!

Jesus doesn't take them back to the site of the execution, neither does he point to the blood-stained hill. Wounds remain, but how he got them is not mentioned except when Thomas doesn't quite buy into the resurrection story. Instead, almost all the post-resurrection events take place at a table, at the breaking of bread with friends.

It is important to note, however, that Jesus never thought about who would be seated next to whom. This attracted criticism from those who observed how he did things:

"Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" (Matt. 9:11)

Jesus had very lenient ideas about dinner parties. He welcomed everyone—tax collectors, sinners, women, Gentiles, the poor, faithful Jews, and ones less so. He wanted everybody to come, to be at the table, and to share food and conversation.

Jesus loved meals. It is no surprise then that the death and resurrection events are sandwiched in the table events—the Last Supper marking the end of the Old World, the last meal under the Roman empire, and the First Meal after the resurrection with the disciples



The first meal—after the resurrection—is a meal of victory, a meal of the new age, the world of mutual service, reciprocity, equality, abundance, generosity, and unending thanksgiving. It was into this meal that the Gentile world would be welcomed at the deliberations of the Jerusalem council in Acts 15.

There is something about the table—this table of welcome—something revolutionary! Something freeing! This table is the hinge of history.

So, come! Pull a chair. Sit at the table.
